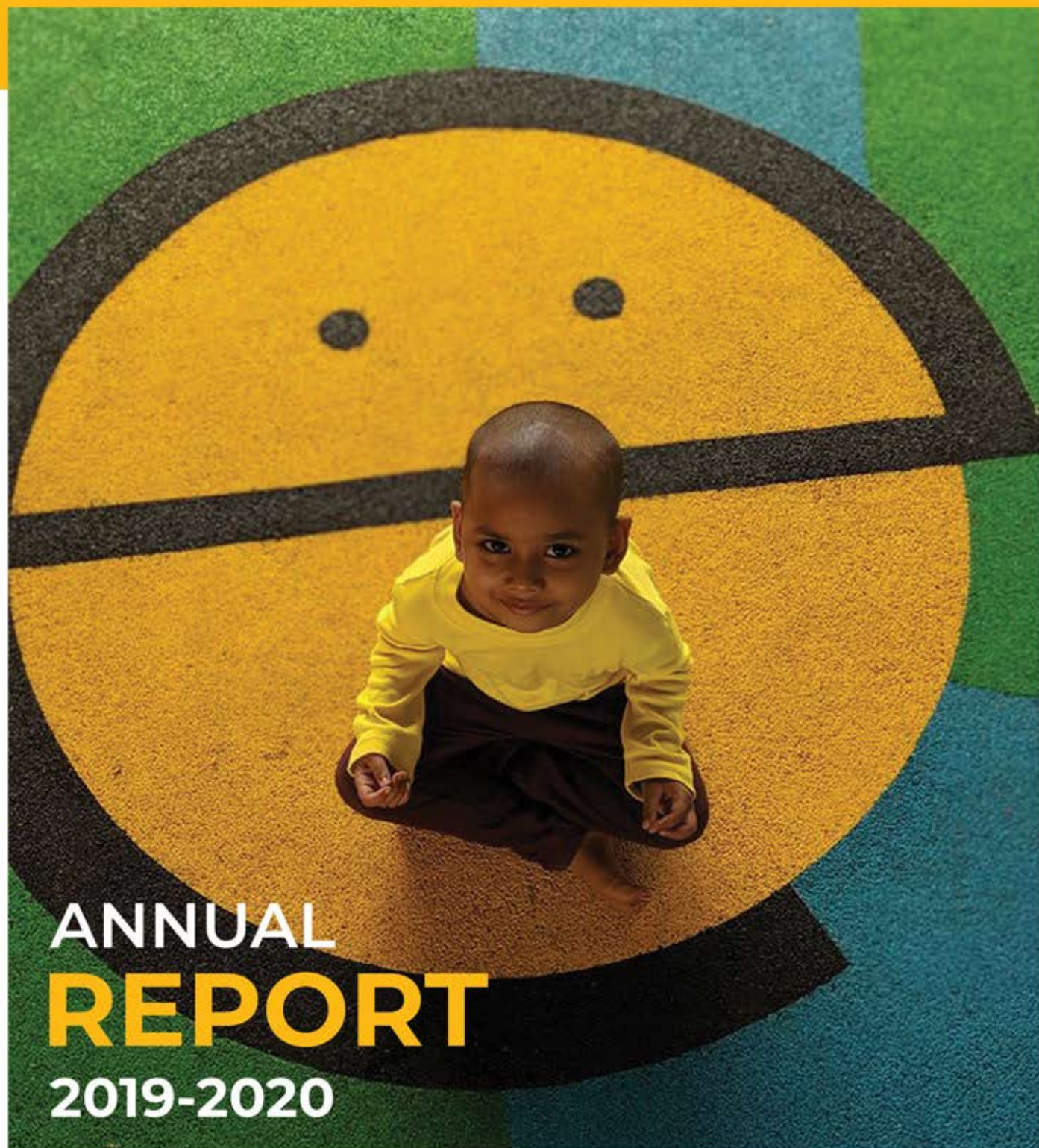

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FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

When we started Access Life six years ago, we had envisioned that every needy child who comes to Mumbai to undergo treatment for cancer would have access to a clean, safe, comfortable, caring and a cost-free accommodation - a home away from home, for both the child and his family. In such a nurturing environment, these little ones would have another opportunity to experience childhood, the way they ought to.

Keeping this in mind, we developed a model at one location, the successful framework of which could then be replicated elsewhere. Thus, we set up the first Access Life Center for Childhood Cancer Care at Chembur, in Mumbai, Maharashtra, in June 2014. The donation of a mini-van by a generous contributor has ensured a stress-free transport to and fro from hospitals for our children.

Along with meeting their physical needs, we have also addressed the psychological and social effects of cancer. Counselling, yoga, music, recreation, education and nutritional supplementation programs have helped in giving the parents and children, the holistic support they need to tackle this challenging disease. As we grew over the years, we added four more centres for accommodating the children and their families and have received four vehicles that help us provide transportation for the children residing at our Centres. At present we have six centres – taking our occupancy capacity to 57 accommodation units that serve the needs of over 170 individuals. Our 6 centres are operating at full capacity and we are looking forward to opening more units. The driving force(s) behind all this are our volunteers and our committed staff who work selflessly.

We have also made a breakthrough by signing an MOU with TATA Hospital, where we offer nutritional counselling services to adolescents and young adults challenged with cancer. Our Clean & Care Hygiene Kit and personal hygiene awareness program are also being appreciated by Wadia, Sion and other hospitals.

But in this journey of trying to spread happiness, we have also faced a major challenge in the form of people unwilling to let out their properties for housing young, poor cancer patients. Creating more awareness on cancer should hopefully motivate more people to open their hearts and homes to these children.

Before the end of Financial Year 2019-20, the entire world was severely challenged by COVID-19 pandemic, which led to a deep impact. We are yet to see the wild consequences of this deadly pandemic. We continue to strive towards our goal of ensuring a healthy & hygienic atmosphere for our brave hearts and their care takers as well as our team members.

ABOUT US

We Are....

A Home away from Home

Access Life Assistance Foundation (ALAF) is a not-for profit organization setup in June 2014 and is registered as a section 8 company under the New Companies Act 2013.

Research indicates 70 -90% of childhood cancers are curable, but the treatment can often be a long drawn one, lasting from anywhere between 5-12 months or sometimes even extending to 24 months. While Hospitals provide quality medical services, these treatments are often offered as day care visits where the patient has to periodically visit the hospital on a regular basis.

Many families who come from remote places across India to Mumbai for their child's cancer treatment have no place to stay during the course of the treatment. Some families end up living on footpaths or in unhygienic conditions due to lack of proper accommodation. When living in such an unhygienic environment without having proper nourishment, these kids start losing their battle against cancer very early on. Many poor families find themselves at crossroads for the want of a good, affordable and hygienic place to stay and have to often abandon treatment and return to their hometown.

Access Life was thus born to provide a loving and temporary home for the outstation children undergoing treatment for cancer and their parents or caretakers.

Besides providing a comfortable shelter for these families, Access Life also addresses the psycho-social impact of cancer by providing nutritional support, safe transportation to hospitals, practical support services, counselling services, educational services, and recreational facilities like music, dance, art and craft and many more.

In addition to the above, one of our initiatives is towards promoting hygienic living amongst families with children fighting cancer. This is in collaboration with Wadia Children's and other Hospitals, where each child is provided with a bag containing a hygiene kit.

Access Life offers nutritional counselling, support and nutritional supplements to adolescents and young adults undergoing cancer treatment at Tata Hospital. In collaboration with Tata hospital, we provide assistance by supplying resources for a balanced diet.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Accommodation:

Access Life engages in serving through its 6-childhood cancer care centres - 5 in Mumbai and 1 in Thane, Maharashtra, India. Our 6 centres are located as below:

Access Life (Main Centre), Jolly Land CHS, Bungalow No 6, Ghatla Village, **Chembur**

- In 2014, Access Life's first center was launched in Chembur, Mumbai, with a mission to minimize some of the challenges faced by these kids and their families. Our office is situated at this center and is equipped to support 4 kids and their families at any point of time.

Access Life (Centre III), Flat E 11, Sukhdayak Society, JB Nagar, **Andheri East**

- In 2016, our third centre was set up at Andheri, Mumbai, which houses 3 kids and their families and is dedicated specifically to accommodating children who have undergone bone marrow transplant.

Access Life (Centre V), 2nd Floor, Plot 403/J, Suswagatam 2, Sion Trombay Road, **Chembur**

- In 2018, we started our fifth centre in Chembur, Mumbai, which supports 12 kids and their families.

Access Life (Centre II), 46, Hill Garden Rows CHS, Chitalsar, Manpada, **Thane West**

- In 2016, our second centre began in Thane which is equipped to support 12 kids and their families.

Access Life (Centre IV), 1st Floor, Guru Nanak Niwas, Sion Trombay Road, **Chembur West**

- In 2017, we began our fourth centre in Chembur, Mumbai, serving 12 kids and their families.

Access Life (Centre IV), Gharaonda building, National College lane, **Bandra West**

- In 2018, we started our sixth centre in Bandra, Mumbai which serves 14 kids and their families.

Keeping our vision in mind since we started Access Life in the Year 2014, at present, 57 underprivileged cancer afflicted children reside along with their guardians in the above 6 centres.



Nutrition :

A well-balanced nutrition is very crucial for the optimum development of children. This requirement is further exaggerated in cases where children are being treated for cancer.

Cancer itself can be debilitating. Furthermore, treatments like chemotherapy and radiation can cause loss of appetite, inability to eat food because of various side effects like nausea, vomiting, mouth ulcers, change of taste, and inability to retain nutrients from food.

If the children are malnourished during the course of their treatments, they will be unable to respond well. Moreover, the impoverished state of the families of these brave hearts and their inability to afford nourishment during the treatment process made it necessary for Access Life to step in to provide nutrition and accommodation.

We at Access Life ensure that the children staying at our centres get appropriate nutrition through the provision of food grains and nutritional supplements required by the children. Additionally, considering the multi-diversity of families staying at Access Life, each family is given a separate gas stove, groceries and other cooking facilities at their accommodation.

Emotional & Psycho-social support :

Access Life believes in adopting a holistic approach to help these kids and their families to fight the dreaded disease. Besides meeting the primary needs of accommodation, nutrition and transportation, Access Life also offers a whole range of support services to the families living at our centres.

Therefore, along with providing the children educational sessions, so that they can join school once they return home and offering parents certain skills to take back home, we provide a gamut of services from yoga, storytelling, art and craft, music and dance and recreational activities.



Transportation :

Each family undertakes on an average, 3-4 trips a week to the hospitals, for tests and treatment, in our 5 donated vehicles & a 26-seater bus. Due to the weak immune system of the children, public transport exposes them to further risk of infections. Easily accessible and stress-free transportation forms an essential part of a supportive care system that is provided by Access Life.



Counseling :

The act of venting out has proved itself to be very helpful and therapeutic.

Counselling services have been an integral part of Access Life. The impact observed in the lives of children and parents is high.

Counselling can help one to cope with Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and with many issues faced during and after the cancer diagnosis and treatment. Different counseling therapies and interventions help heal and put across a clear vision of the purpose of living with motivation and encouragement.

In the latter part of Year 2019-20, a professional In-house counsellor joined us on board, and she supported the kids, parents and occasionally the staff with sessions related to

- Behavioural issues
- Eating habits
- Psycho-education
- Motivation & Self-esteem
- Team building
- Palliative Care Counselling
- Bereavement counselling
- Counselling for Anxiety, Depression & Fear
- Health & Hygiene



Yoga :

Anxiety, depression, tiredness (fatigue) and stress for some patients are treated with positive effects of yoga. Yoga sessions are held once a week for the parents and children, by trained yoga instructors who volunteer their services.



Non-formal Education :

When the children are in Mumbai during the course of their prolonged treatment, they tend to miss out on regular school. Hence, efforts are made to keep them mentally engaged through non-formal educational sessions in order to create a bridge for them when they go back to their hometown and rejoin school. Informal education activities continue to mentally stimulate the curious minds of our bravehearts.



Skill Training Activity for Parents:

Giving up on earning a livelihood for the sake of one's children is tough; hence efforts are made to be able to equip these parents with certain skills to keep them engaged in meaningful activities during their stay at our Centers. The Brave heart Collection - a line of hand-crafted products created by the parents of the children, was launched in 2015. Till date the Access Life has sold products like Rakhis, Diyas and Torans, the sales proceeds though modest, gives a sense of fulfillment to the parents. Product making at our centres –gives roots and wings to parents.

Art and Craft Activity:

Art empowers in finding the inner talents in one's own self. Art based therapy is an expressive form of therapy that uses the creative medium of Music, Dance Movement, Painting and Craft to improve a person's physical, mental and emotional well-being. We have experts in these fields offering their voluntary services at our centers, for the children and their families.



Recreation - Accesslife Arts & Gana (ALAG):

With the help of generous donors, we have equipped the centers with television sets, music systems, books, toys and games to keep the children and their families engaged. Also, different recreational activities like musical shows, film screenings, story-telling sessions, magic shows are organized for them on a regular basis.

We also encourage people to come and celebrate their birthdays or special days at our centers with the children and their families.



Hygiene Kit:

The Access Life Clean and Care Kit is one of our initiatives towards promoting hygienic living amongst families with children fighting cancer. This is in collaboration with Wadia Children's and other hospitals, where each child is provided with a bag containing a hygiene kit.



Adoloscents & Young Adults (AYA) Program:

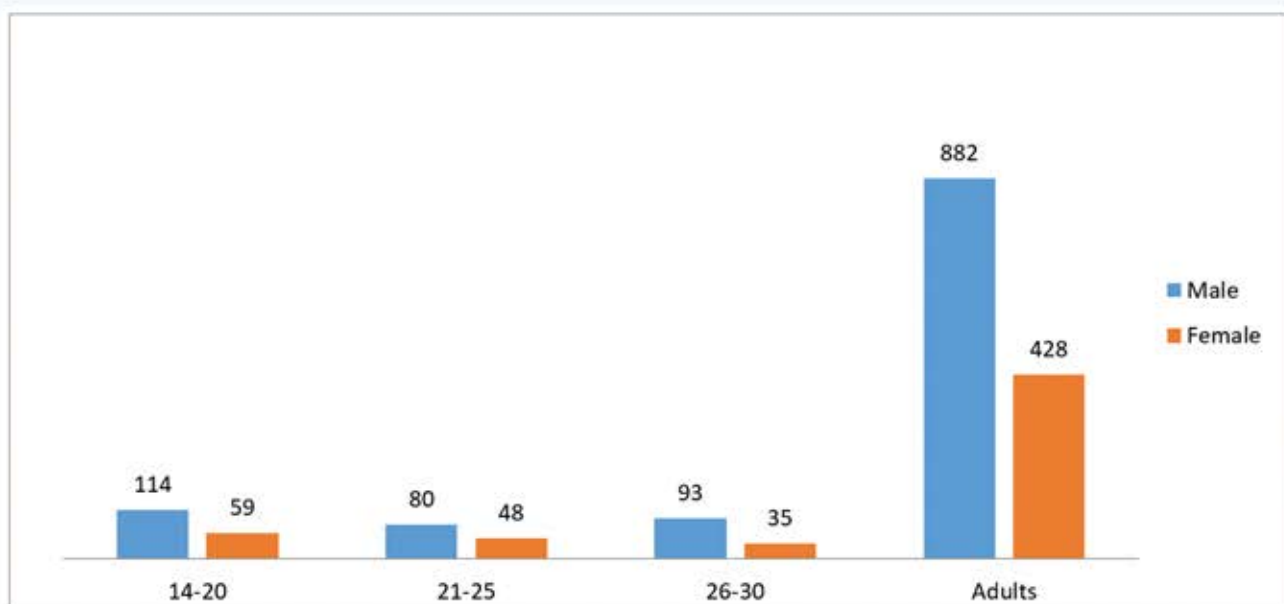
Access Life offers nutritional counseling and support for adolescents & young adults from the age of 14 to 30 years, undergoing cancer treatment at Tata Hospital. In collaboration with Tata hospital, we provide assistance by supplying resources for a balanced diet. Our nutritionists are trained at the best institutes, they are carefully chosen for their knowledge, empathy, and ability to work with AYA and survive in tough conditions. They are then briefed in Oncology by some of the best oncologists in the country at Tata Memorial hospital.

We are delighted and proud to mention that within a short span of initiating our nutritional assessment, awareness and support project at Tata Memorial hospital, we have reached out to support 1739 newly diagnosed beneficiaries. These efforts will go a long way in helping these brave hearts, tide over the challenges during treatment and thereby facilitate their recovery.

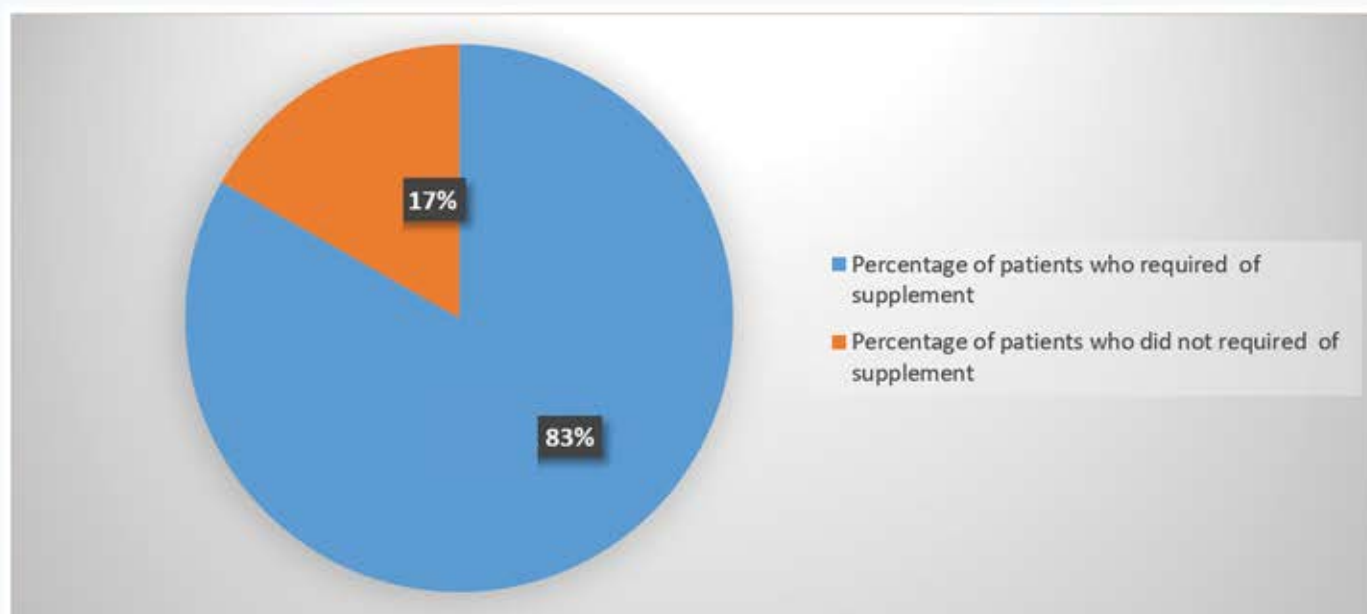
Total Number of Patients Gender Wise



Tata hospital has over the years, roped in NGOs and availed of support from CSR programs to provide mid-day meal, low cost and nutritious snacks like sattu powder and hire nutritionists for counselling. However due to the unmanageable large patient load and existing nutritionist unable to offer all the needed group sessions and individual diet plans to patients, a specific unmet need was identified by the haemato-oncology Department.

Against this background, Tata hospital approached Access Life for support. Access Life responded by deputing initially 2 and later 3 nutritionists at the Tata hospital to support the nutritional assessment and counselling activities for the AYA patients. Further, the less affording AYA patients needed nutritional supplementation to assist them tide over the critical period of their treatment. This support was also offered by Access Life. An MOU is now operational between the two organizations, and efforts are aimed at achieving better nutritional and follow-up rates for the supported AYAs.

THE COVID-19 CHALLENGE



Since March 2019, the world is witnessing a pandemic that has left millions paralyzed with fear. Everything is under lockdown, all of us are safe sheltered in our homes, but spare a thought, think about those families, really poor farmer families who have come to cities from their villages to get better treatment for their cancer-ridden children. They have nowhere to go, no money, no food, no shelter. They are in absolute panic right now and their children are still fighting for their lives. Especially when they are fighting this cancer, their immunity is so low that they become prime candidates, and are at high risk to contract the Corona Virus infection.

Our brave hearts, families, and team members at Access Life have been continuously supported by the generosity of our supporters. Keeping in mind the current scenario of COVID-19, we took the necessary precautionary measures to safeguard our children and their families.

- An early meeting was held in the 2nd week of March, between the Management of Access Life and the team members, briefing about the situation. A detailed discussion was held with each team member on all the necessary arrangements to be made in their respective avenues, in case the situation worsened. Our utmost primary goal remained that our brave hearts shouldn't get affected, in any situation and there should be no compromise on the health and safety of our families and our team members.
- A few hours of brainstorming led to multiple decisive actions and the team strongly ventured in fulfilling these timely needs, to ensure that our cancer beneficiaries have least impact, due to this uncalled situation.
- Initial steps included immediate restriction on visitors/volunteers/vendors at all our Centres.
- The families were counselled on the situation, with active involvement of our counsellor and Centre Managers. All were strictly informed about hygiene measures to be followed by themselves and their children. They were briefed about not stepping out in the surroundings or to the hospital, if it doesn't seem necessary.
- We placed orders and sourced the required quantities of masks, sanitizers, hand washes, soaps and disinfectants to be provided to all families, at all centres, and in all our vehicles.
- All our centres and vehicles were frequently sanitized to ensure that the kids and their guardians were transported to and from hospitals in hygienic vehicles.
- Grocery was stocked up in all our centres for a period of 2 months.



- The emergency contact numbers of nearby Doctors/ Hospitals/ Electrician/ Plumber/ Maintenance personnel, etc were rechecked and put up in all centres.
- The centre in-charge personnel were trained and informed on how to handle any person showing symptoms related to common flu/ cold/ fever and in case of any abnormality, when to suspect Covid-19 cases, and the required steps to be taken. Awareness programs with specific do's and don'ts were also followed.
- Our supervisory and managerial staff was asked to work from home. All the required computer related accessories and/or documents/files, etc were moved to their respective homes, to assist in the smooth functioning and support, while working remotely.
- Video conferencing facilities for all our Management team, Centre Managers and counsellors was put in place, enabling them to monitor and function from their homes.
- Individual and group counselling sessions for kids and parents were conducted remotely by our qualified counsellor.
- Many in house activities such as yoga, recreational and fun activities for engaging the kids and parents during their stay, were done through our own initiative and being guided and monitored remotely.

Amongst the essential staff, our front-line team worked tirelessly and selflessly, ensuring the smooth functioning at all Access Life centres.

- Centre Coordinators who stay 24x7 at the centres, kept a close watch and assisting all families at every step.
- Drivers ensured that the families are taken and brought back from the hospitals and that no child misses on their hospital visits.

CASE STUDY I

**ATHARVA VIJAY DESHPANDE
AURANGABAD, MAHARASHTRA**

Atharva Vijay Deshpande, a 9-year old hails from Aurangabad and has a sibling aged 5yrs old. Father was engaged as a Cinema operator and mother is a homemaker. When little Atharva developed a fever with a severe backache, he was admitted at MGM Hospital. With the recurrence of fever, he felt weak after every visit to doctors. He was shifted to Sahyadri Hospital, and the MRI results landed up in front of the family suggesting that this might be a Blood cancer. The family decided to take a second opinion at Hegde Hospital where they were told to give up and proceed back home, saying there was no medical help they could offer.

The dejected family was consoled by a friend who convinced them to meet a trusted doctor on this case. After all the saying goes "A single thread of hope is still a very powerful thing."

Dr. Deshpande used his network and arranged to send the family to Tata Memorial Hospital in Mumbai. A series of diagnostic tests confirmed the blood cancer with a period of 6 months long treatment and 6 rounds of chemotherapy and injections.

The family has borrowed money from family and friends and depends on Atharva's father's sister for the monthly expenses for managing the living of his little sibling, who is staying back with her paternal Grandparents back home. As soon as Atharva's father, who is the sole earning member for his family informed his employer about the 6 months of stay required in Mumbai, he lost his job. With no place to stay in metropolis Mumbai, the family had no other option but to stay for 6 days on the footpaths, all along, worrying about the child's vulnerability during the cancer treatment. They were referred to Access Life through a social worker and joined Access Life family on 22 December 2019. Atharva is very helpless and weak after every chemo session. Nutrition provided at the centre is highly appreciated by his mother who dreads about the days spent on the streets and feels the safety and security a caring shelter provides is unsurmountable.

Atharva turned a bright child, enthusiastically participating in all the academic activities conducted at the centre.



CASE STUDY II

**OM PAWAR
KORANGALA, MAHARASHTRA**

Om Pawar, an 8.5-year old has originated from Korangala, Maharashtra, has a sibling sister aged 3.5-year-old. His father is a farmer by profession and mother a homemaker. When little Om Pawar developed lumps on his neck, underarms and inner thigh, for the initial 10 days, he was taken to visit the doctor at a private hospital, post which the family shifted him to a government hospital for 6 days, as their funds were exhausted. The doctors performed blood tests which confirmed a Blood cancer.

The parents decided to go through alternate treatments such as Acupuncture and Ayurveda. A good Samaritan coaxed the family to visit Tata Memorial Hospital in Mumbai where a treatment of 4 cycles of Chemotherapy and a bone marrow operation was advised. It has been a long period of 11 months of stay including one month of maintenance too.

The family was pretty disturbed and they feared losing their child. The father being a farmer, earned his livelihood by his presence on the fields. They were in a poor financial state much before the onset of the disease, which played as a catalyst to shatter their world; they borrowed loans from many dear friends and relatives.

Upon arrival at Mumbai, they lived on streets for several days while Om went through all the required tests for the bone marrow. Looking at their poor condition, a hospital social worker recommended them to Access Life. The family has well-adjusted to Access Life. His immunity is good which helps him withstand each chemo session well. The family feels indebted to the hospital and appreciates the professional attitude of the doctors. Also, they are extremely filled with gratitude for all the facilities provided at Access Life, they speak about a paradigm shift about routines, the hygienic living conditions and centre kept well maintained. They feel it would have not been possible to manage by themselves, mainly due to lack of knowledge and the battle against cancer. Om immensely misses his sibling back home. His grandparents and his uncle have rallied around the family in these difficult times.
